

## **Representative to the AKC Pointing Breed Advisory Committee**

### **1. Purpose**

The AKC Pointing Breed Advisory Committee is composed of one representative from each of the AKC recognized Pointing Breed parent Clubs. The committee acts only in an advisory capacity to the AKC. The time and location of the meetings are determined by the AKC.

### **2. WCA Representative**

- a. The AKC will notify the WCA when the next meeting will occur. The WCA Field Advisory Committee will be advised of the meeting and will provide the WCA Board with a list of potential representatives. The WCA Board will select three members from the list and submit their names to the AKC for their final selection.

### **3. Duties**

- a. Upon appointment to the Pointing Breed Advisory Committee, time will be of the essence to accomplish the duties within the time frames set by the AKC.
- b. Request the FAC prepare a list of items that should be included in the agenda for the meeting. These could be rule changes, clarifications or items of concern.
- c. Review the agenda proposed by The AKC with the FAC and request the FAC provide a recommendation on each item.
- d. Send the FAC recommendations to the WCA Secretary to poll the WCA Board members for their approval.

**NOTE:** The AKC will decide which items will be included in the meeting's agenda.

- e. Attend the Pointing Breed Advisory meeting and vote for the changes and revisions consistent with the WCA Board's direction. **The WCA Representative will consider the overall best interests of the WCA and avoid decision-making based upon his/her personal views.**
- f. After the AKC publishes the minutes of the meeting, the WCA Representative will prepare an article for *The Weimaraner Magazine* that summarizes the meeting and how to receive a complete copy of The AKC minutes.

## Field Advisory Committee

### 1. Purpose

The Weimaraner Club of America Field Advisory Committee (FAC) shall be the primary contact for field related subjects. Advice and recommendations will be provided to the WCA Board of Directors on current issues and future changes that will be necessary to ensure the perpetuation of quality Weimaraner field events. (WCA Rating Tests will be addressed by the Ratings/Hunting Committee.)

### 2. Committee

The FAC shall consist of five members and two non-voting members, the Chairperson and the National Field Trial Chairperson

- a. All FAC members shall be in good standing with the Weimaraner Club of America.
- b. The Chairperson shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years by the WCA Board of Directors, will have no voting power (except to decide ties) but will be the administrator and coordinator of all FAC activities and serve as liaison between the WCA Board and FAC.
- c. Members shall be appointed for terms of three years by the WCA Board, two in year one, one plus the Chairperson in year two, two in year three, National Field Trial Chairperson as required.
- d. The geographical regions of the United States shall be fairly represented.
- e. A person may serve consecutive terms and/or hold any other office while serving on FAC.

### 3. Qualifications

The FAC member should be very experienced and knowledgeable in the organization, conduct and judging of field trials. Each proposed FAC member should include in their application their experience in the following:

- a. Field Trial Chairperson, Judge or Secretary.
- b. Field Titles earned, training and handling.
- c. Continuous course trials.
- d. Any other field related activities.

Any information relating to the size, number, pointing breeds, dates, type, etc. of the above will assist the WCA Board in the selection process. Letters of recommendation from others are optional.

### 4. Selection Process

Each August the request for FAC applications will be published in *The Weima-*

*raner Magazine* with a submission date of no later than October 1. The WCA Board will make the appointments at the December Board meeting.

## WCA Classic Field Events

### 1. Purpose

The WCA will hold three (3) Classic Field Events each year. These events will be similar to the National Field Trial and will be held in three different geographical areas of the United States.

### 2. Events

The **Western Classic** will be held between February 15 and March 15.

The **Eastern Classic** will be held between April 1 and May 15.

The **Mid-America Classic** will be held between October 15 and November 8.

A **WCA Field Futurity** will be held in conjunction with each Classic.

Classic Field Events will be **“OPEN to WEIMARANERS ONLY”**

All Classic Field Events shall be AKC licensed and conducted under the latest version of the AKC Field Trial Rules and Procedures. Additional WCA rules are stated within this set of rules. (For the Field Futurity Rules, see the Futurity Rules.)

### 3. Host Club

- a. The Classic Events are WCA events that are hosted by a local Weimaraner Club or by an individual WCA member in good standing with the WCA.
- b. The Field Trial Chairperson, Secretary and **ALL** members of the Field Trial Committee must be members in good standing of the WCA.
- c. When an individual hosts a WCA Classic Field Trial, 50% of the financial gain from the event shall be donated to an organization designated by the Classic host and approved by the WCA Board that will promote the Weimaraner and 50% shall be donated to the WCA. The Classic host will submit a financial statement. In the event of a loss, the Classic host may submit a request to the WCA Board for reimbursement of the loss. Financial statements and the reasons for the loss will accompany the request for reimbursement. The WCA Board will then decide on the amount of reimbursement, if any.

### 4. Approvals

- a. The Field Advisory Committee's Request Form must be completely filled out and sent to the FAC Chairperson at least eighteen (18) months prior to the event.
- b. The FAC will review, may ask for additional information, arrive at a recommendation and forward it to the WCA Secretary. The WCA Board will then vote on the request for approval to host a Classic.

### 5. Courses and Stakes

- 
- a. Western or Eastern or Mid- America Open All Age Classic
    1. This is a mandatory stake.
    2. Must be conducted in one (1) hour braces.
    3. Single Course is acceptable, but a Continuous Course is preferred.
    4. Dogs in contention will be called back to retrieve.
    5. Will be a money stake (see prizes paragraph this section).
  - b. WCA Western or Eastern or Mid- America Field Futurity
    1. This is a mandatory stake.
    2. See Futurity Rules for details.
  - c. Western or Eastern or Mid- America Amateur Gun Dog Classic
    1. This is a mandatory stake.
    2. Conducted in 30 minute braces.
    3. Single Course is acceptable but a continuous course is preferred.
    4. Dogs in contention will be called back to retrieve.
  - d. Western or Eastern or Mid- America Open Puppy Classic
    1. This is a mandatory stake.
    2. Conducted in twenty (20) minute braces.
    3. Single course is acceptable.
    4. Birds may be released at the option of the Host Club.
    5. There will be NO firing of blanks over puppies in this stake.
  - e. Western or Eastern or Mid- America Open Derby Classic
    1. This is a mandatory stake.
    2. Conducted in 30- minute braces.
    3. Single course is acceptable.
    4. Birds shall be released for each brace.
    5. Will be a money stake (See Prizes paragraph this section).
  - f. Western or Eastern or Mid- America Open Gun Dog Classic
    1. This is a mandatory stake.
    2. Conducted in accordance with AKC rules.
    3. Dogs in contention will be called back to retrieve.
    4. Conducted in 45 minute braces.

g. Other Stakes

Additional recognized AKC stakes can be part of the WCA Classic at the option of the Host Club or the Individual Host. The addition of any stakes shall not compromise the quality of the WCA Classic event.

- h. The WCA Classic may have multiple courses in use at any time at the option of the Host Club.

## 6. Judges

- a. The Host Club shall select all judges for their WCA Classic event. The FAC does not approve the host club's selection.
- b. An Individual hosting a Classic shall obtain approval of the judges from the Field Advisory Committee. The judges' panel, together with their resumes, will be sent to the FAC Chairperson at least six (6) months prior to the event. The FAC will have two (2) weeks from the day the FAC Chairperson receives the request to disapprove any judge. Two (2) NO votes of the FAC voting members are required to disapprove a judge. Any NO vote shall be accompanied by the rationale for the negative vote. If there is no response from the FAC to the Classic Host within two (2) weeks after the FAC Chairperson receives the request, the judges' slate shall be deemed approved.
- c. Neither the FAC Chairperson nor any member of the FAC may serve as a judge for any stake at the Western or Eastern or Mid- America Classics.
- d. Classic Hosts shall endeavor to obtain the judicial services of candidates possessing the broadest possible previous judicial experience.

## 7. Retrieving Call Backs

- a. Any mature, strong- flying upland game bird shall be satisfactory for utilization in callbacks, with strong preference to be given to pheasants or chukar.
- b. Birds shall be planted in the birdfield as the judges shall direct.
- c. Birds should be planted a sufficient distance from the gallery/spectators so as to minimize interference with the dog's performance and to maximize gunner safety.
- d. Gunners shall use only double- barreled shotguns of at least .20 gauge; semi- automatic and pump shotguns are prohibited.
- e. During callbacks, blaze orange shall be worn by all judges, handlers, gunners and the game steward.

## 8. Scribe/Photographer

- a. The scribe(s) will prepare a brace- by- brace write up for the WCA Western, Eastern or Mid- America Open All Age Classics and Amateur Gun Dog Classic.
- b. The write up shall include the placements of all of the other stakes and a

brace-by-brace write up shall be optional.

- c. Photographs of all placements, in all stakes, should be taken. The photos should include the dogs, their handlers, judges and the owners, if available.
- d. The write up and photos shall be submitted to *The Weimaraner Magazine* editor within 30 days of the last day of the Classic. Failure to meet this time frame may subject the Host Club to fines imposed by the WCA Board.
- e. To have the highest picture quality and the least number of errors in the text, the photos should be at least 150 dpi and the text should be sent by e-mail or disk in Rich Text (RTF) format.

### **9. AKC Application and Premium List**

- a. The application information for the Classic event needs to be sent to the WCA Executive Secretary at least four (4) months prior to the event. The Executive Secretary will fill out the AKC forms and send same to the AKC with the appropriate fee for their approval. The Executive Secretary will arrange for the Premium List to be prepared.
- b. Any WCA rule that is in addition to the AKC rules shall be included within the premium. Also, any options that the AKC rules allow need to be stated. Topics for inclusion include:
  - 1. Bitches in season.
  - 2. Training on grounds.
  - 3. Any special requirements to use the grounds.
  - 4. Puppies not fired over.
  - 5. Tracking collars.
  - 6. Money stakes.
  - 7. ALL prizes, trophies (includes rotating trophies) and rosettes.
  - 8. Stakes and courses.
  - 9. Retrieving.
  - 10. Birds.
  - 11. Etc.

### **10. Prizes**

- a. Rosettes shall be given to all placed dogs and also to those that receive a Judges' Award of Merit.
- b. All the rotating trophies associated with each Classic shall be presented to the winners. If no winner is selected, then the trophy will remain with the previous year's winner. Refer to Section on Traveling Trophies of these rules for more information.
- c. Non-rotating trophies shall be given to all placed dogs in all stakes.

- d. All non-rotating trophies and rosettes should be of a quality that is commensurate with a WCA Classic Event.
- e. In a money stake, prize money will be paid to first, second, third and fourth placed dogs. Fifty percent (50%) of the entry fee (net of grounds use fees, if any) for the stake will be used as the prize money. If four placements are given, the split is 40%, 30%, 20%, 10%. If three placements are given, the split is 50%, 30%, 20%. If two placements are given, the split is 70%, 30%. If one placement is given, that placement receives 100%. In the event that no placements are given, the prize money will be sent to the WCA Treasurer and will be added to the prize money at the next year's Classic.

### 11. Additional Rules

- a. The latest edition of the AKC Field Trial Rules and Procedures shall be used to conduct all stakes at a Classic Field event, except for the WCA Field Futurity. (See Futurity Rules.)
- b. A .22 caliber or larger blank pistol shall be used for all stakes, except puppy. Small crimp .22 blanks and shotguns are not permitted.
- c. No dog competing in a Classic event shall train on the same grounds during the seven days immediately preceding the first day of running of the Classic event. For the purposes of this rule, dogs entered in another field trial on the same grounds shall not be considered during such competition to be training.
- d. “**Bitches in Season**” shall be allowed to compete in all required stakes.
- e. Tracking collars shall be allowed in all stakes subject to all applicable AKC rules and procedures governing the same.
- f. The drawing for braces and running order shall take place no later than the day before the start of the Classic event.

### 12. Field Trial Closeout

- a. Submit all required documents and **check** to AKC within their time limits.
- b. Submit the write up and placements to the editor of *The Weimaraner Magazine* along with a check made out to the WCA for \$0.50 per dog within 30 days after the trial.
- c. Submit a check made out to the Weimaraner Foundation Fund for \$2.00 per entry to Executive Secretary, Weimaraner Club of America, within 30 days after the conclusion of the trial.
- d. The Field Futurity placements and number of dogs that ran in the stake must be sent to the Futurity Administrator within five (5) days of the event.

## WCA National Field Trial

### 1. Purpose

The WCA will hold a National Field Trial each year in December to award the titles of “National Weimaraner Field Champion of 20\_\_” and the “National Amateur Weimaraner Field Champion of 20\_\_”.

### 2. Event

- a. The National Field Trial will begin in the morning on the first Saturday in December every year at Lake Murray Field Trial Grounds, Ardmore, Oklahoma.
- b. A WCA Field Futurity shall be held in conjunction with the National Field Trial.
- c. All stakes of the National Field Trial will be **“Open to Weimaraners Only.”**
- d. All stakes run at the National Field Trial shall be AKC licensed and conducted under the latest version of the AKC Field Trial Rules and Procedures. Additional WCA rules are stated within this set of rules. (For the National Futurity, See Futurity Rules.)
- e. Bitches in season may compete in all stakes.

### 3. National Field Trial Chairperson (NFTC)

- a. The Field Trial Chairperson, Secretary and all members of the Field Trial Committee shall be members of the WCA in good standing.
- b. The WCA Board will appoint the NFTC at its December Board meeting for the following year.
- c. As soon as possible after his/her appointment, the NFTC will select four (4) stake managers, one (1) hospitality manager and the Field Trial Secretary.
- d. The NFTC shall be a non-voting member of the FAC during their tenure as NFTC.
- e. The NFTC will update the National Field Trial Procedures at the end of the event and give a copy to the FAC Chairperson.
- f. The NFTC will consider the overall best interests of the National Field Championships and avoid decision-making based upon his/her personal views.

### 4. Courses and Stakes

- a. National Weimaraner Field Championship
  1. This is a mandatory stake.
  2. Shall be conducted in one (1) hour braces.
  3. A continuous course is required.

4. Dogs in contention will be called back to retrieve.
  5. Will be a money stake. (See prizes paragraph this section.)
  6. Open to any Weimaraner which, at the time entries close for this stake, is a Field Champion or an Amateur Field Champion, or has placed first, second, third or fourth in any AKC broke dog stake such as an Open or Amateur All- Age stake or an Open or Amateur Gun Dog stake. The event, stake and placement that qualified the dog to be entered shall be submitted with the entry.
- b. WCA National Field Futurity
1. This is a mandatory stake.
  2. See Futurity Rules.
- c. National Amateur Weimaraner Field Championship
1. This is a mandatory stake.
  2. Shall be conducted in one (1) hour braces.
  3. Continuous course is required.
  4. Dogs in contention will be called back to retrieve.
  5. Open to any Weimaraner which at the time entries close for this stake, while being owned by an amateur, has earned its Field Championship or Amateur Field Championship, or has placed first, second, third or fourth in any AKC broke dog stake such as an Open or Amateur All- Age stake or an Open or Amateur Gun Dog stake. The event, stake and placement that qualified the dog to be entered shall be submitted with the entry. Only persons who, in the judgment of the Field Trial Committee, are qualified as amateurs, as defined in Chapter 14, Section 2 of the AKC Rules for Pointing Breed Field Trials may serve as a scout in the National Amateur Championship Stake.
- d. National Open Derby
1. This is a mandatory stake
  2. Conducted in thirty (30) minute braces.
  3. Continuous course required.
  4. Will be a money stake. (See Prizes paragraph, this section.)

The WCA National Field Trial shall have only one course in use at any time, which is to say that there will be no concurrent running of stakes.

## 5. Judges

- a. The NFTC shall ask each stake manager for three names of potential judges.
- b. Judges should come from different parts of the country and have knowledge and experience judging continuous course trials.

- c. The NFTC will select a preferred judges' slate and an alternate slate. The judging slates will be sent to the FAC Chairperson at least six (6) months prior to the event. The FAC will have two (2) weeks from the day the FAC Chairperson receives the request to disapprove any judge. Two NO votes of the FAC members are required to disapprove a judge. Any NO vote shall be in writing and accompanied with the rationale for the vote. FAC shall, within three (3) weeks after the FAC Chairperson has received the request, approve or disapprove the judges' slate.
- d. The FAC Chairperson and any member of the FAC are prohibited from serving as a judge for any stake at the National Field Trial.

## **6. Retrieving Call Backs**

- a. Mature flight- conditioned pheasants shall be used in the callbacks.
- b. Birds shall be planted as the judges shall direct.
- c. Birds should be planted a sufficient distance from the gallery/spectators so as to minimize interference with the dog's performance and to maximize gunner safety.
- d. Gunners shall use only double- barreled shotguns of at least .20 gauge; semi- automatic and pump shotguns are prohibited.
- e. During callbacks blaze orange shall be worn by all judges, handlers, gunners and the game steward.

## **7. Scribe/Photographer**

- a. The scribe(s) will prepare a brace- by- brace write up for each of the stakes.
- b. Photographs of all placements should be taken. The photos should include the dogs, handlers, judges and owners, if available.
- c. The write up and photos shall be submitted to *The Weimaraner Magazine* editor within 30 days after the trial.
- d. To have the highest picture quality and the least number of errors in the text, the photos should be at least 150 dpi and the text should be sent by e-mail or disk in Rich Text (RTF) format.

## **8. AKC Application and Premium List**

- a. The application information for the National Field Trial is sent to the WCA Executive Secretary, who will fill out the AKC forms and send them to AKC for approval. This needs to occur four (4) months prior to the start of the trial. The Executive Secretary will arrange for the Premium List to be prepared.
- b. Any WCA rule that supplements or modifies AKC rules shall be included within the premium. Also, any options that the AKC rules allow shall be stated in the premium. The topics for inclusion include:

1. Bitches in Season.
2. Training on the grounds (any specific rules or policies for use of the grounds).
3. Tracking Collars.
4. Money Stakes.
5. All prizes, trophies (includes rotating trophies), and rosettes.
6. Stakes and Courses.
7. Retrieve.
8. Birds.
9. Definition of “Amateur” (See above.).

## **9. Prizes**

- a. Rosettes shall be given to all placed dogs and also to those that receive a Judges Award of Merit.
- b. All of the rotating trophies associated with the National Field Trial shall be presented to the winners. If no winner is selected, the trophy/s will remain with last year’s winner. Refer to Section on Traveling Trophies of these rules for more information.
- c. Non- rotating trophies shall be given to all placed dogs.
- d. All non- rotating trophies and rosettes should be of a quality that is commensurate with a WCA National Championship.
- e. In a money stake, prize money will be paid to first, second, third and fourth placed dogs. Fifty percent (50%) of the entry fee (net of grounds use fees, if any) for the stake will be used as prize money. If four placements are given, the split is 40%, 30%, 20%, 10%.
- f. If three placements are given, the split is 50%, 30%, 20%. If two placements are given, the split will be 70%, 30%. If one placement is given, that placement receives 100%. In the event there are no placements, the prize money will be sent to the WCA Treasurer and will be added as prize money at the next years National Field Trial.

## **10. Additional Rules**

- a. The latest version of the AKC Field Trial Rules and Procedures shall be used to conduct all stakes, except the WCA Field Futurity.
- b. The WCA National Field Trial shall have only one continuous course in use at any time.
- c. A .22 caliber or larger blank pistol shall be used for all stakes. Small crimp .22 blanks and shotguns are not permitted.
- d. Any dog competing in the National Field Trial must not have had any train-

ing on the same grounds during the seven days prior to the start of the National Field Trial. Being entered in a field trial on the grounds during the seven day period does not constitute training.

- e. “Bitches in Season” must be allowed to compete.
- f. Tracking collars shall be allowed in all stakes. AKC’s rules and procedures shall apply.
- g. The drawing for braces and the running order shall take place no later than the day before the start of the National Field Trial.

#### **11. Field Trial Closeout**

- a. Submit all required documents and **check** to AKC within their time limits.
- b. Submit the write up, photos and placements to the editor of *The Weimaraner Magazine* within 30 days after the trial.
- c. Submit a check made out to the Weimaraner Foundation Fund for \$2.00 per entry to Executive Secretary, Weimaraner Club of America, within 30 days after the conclusion of the trial.
- d. The Field Futurity placements and number of dogs that ran in the stake must be sent to the Futurity Administrator within five (5) days of the event.

## Local Club Field Trials

### 1. Purpose

The Weimaraner Club of America encourages Local Weimaraner Clubs to host AKC Field Trials. It is at these events that many Weimaraner owners are exposed to the sport of Field Trials for the first time.

### 2. Approvals

- a. The local club will submit all of the appropriate forms and fees to the AKC directly for their approval.
- b. As the AKC will require parent club approval of all local field trials, local Clubs wishing to conduct a field trial should submit the request for approval to the WCA Executive Secretary two (2) weeks prior to the submission to the AKC.
- c. The WCA Executive Secretary will send the AKC parent club approval if:
  1. The local club is in good standing with the WCA.
  2. The local club is current with any financial obligation to the WCA.
  3. The field trial has a minimum of three (3) AKC regular stakes per trial (or four (4) AKC Regular stakes per year) “Open to Weimaraners only” and one of such stakes shall be a puppy or derby stake.”
- d. The WCA will not coordinate dates of Field Trials to avoid conflicts between local clubs.

### 3. Closeout

- a. At the conclusion of the local Field Trial, all forms and additional funds will be submitted directly to AKC.
- b. If the local Club wishes to have an article published in *The Weimaraner Magazine* reporting upon the local trial, the text, placements and pictures should be submitted to the Editor of *The Weimaraner Magazine*. The Editor has the discretion as to when/if the article will be published and, if published, the content thereof.
- c. The WCA fee of \$0.50 per dog entered must be paid within 30 days of the event.

## Traveling Trophies

The Weimaraner Club of America has a number of Traveling Trophies for the winners of specific WCA events. These trophies have been donated by members to commemorate another member, a particular dog or just to provide a significant Trophy for a National or Regional event. Local clubs may have Traveling Trophies for their events provided that the Local Club shall be entirely responsible for the care and maintenance of such Traveling Trophies.

### 1. WCA Responsibility

- a. All of the Traveling Trophies (except local Traveling Trophies) are owned by the WCA.
- b. Normal wear caused by the transportation and handling is paid for by the WCA.
- c. The addition of more space for name-plates shall be provided by the WCA at its expense.
- d. The WCA Board shall approve all additional Traveling Trophies.
- e. The WCA Board shall determine the disposition of all Traveling Trophies that are retired.
- f. The WCA Board will give due consideration to special requirements the donor may have.

### 2. Trophy Holder

- a. Responsible for returning the Trophy in a clean, undamaged state.
- b. Responsible for having their nameplate engraved in a manner consistent with the other engraving on the trophy.
- c. Responsible for repairing the trophy back to original condition if it is damaged as a result of their negligence. The trophy holder shall insure the trophy for its replacement cost whenever the trophy is shipped.
- d. If repairs are needed that the WCA is responsible for, the trophy holder shall obtain an estimate of the cost of the repairs and forward same to the WCA Treasurer with a request for payment. The Treasurer may ask for a second estimate. Subject to Board approval, the WCA will then pay for the repairs.

### 3. New Trophies

- a. New Traveling Trophies shall be of a quality that reflects the importance of winning the event. The event should be prestigious and held annually.
- b. No more than two (2) traveling Trophies shall be permitted for any one event.
- c. All new trophies must be accompanied by a sturdy and appropriate traveling case.

- d. Proposals for new trophies require the recommendation of the committee representing that event, i.e. FAC, NSC, etc. and will require WCA Board approval.
- e. The following minimum information shall be submitted with the proposal:
  1. Donor or Donors.
  2. In Memory of \_\_\_\_\_
  3. Disposition of trophy when retired.
